- Rescue into this area will likely be delayed due to the unique nature of the area.
- Please respect closed ropes and closed trail designations. Stay on open trails only.
- Skiing/riding on closed terrain can result in a loss of privileges.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

Skiing can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross country and other specialized ski equipment such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes, always show courtesy to others and be aware of elements of risk in skiing which personal awareness and common sense can help reduce can help reduce. Observe the following code and share with other skiers the responsibility for a great skiing experience.

Know the Code—It's Your Responsibility.

(This is a partial list; be safety conscious. Officially endorsed by the National Ski Areas Association.)

- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid people or objects.
- People ahead or downhill of you have the right-of-way. You must avoid them.
- Stop only where you are visible from above and do not restrict traffic.
- Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail.
- You must prevent runaway equipment.
- Read and obey all signs, warnings, and hazard markings.

- Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- You must know how and be able to load, ride and unload lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant.
- Do not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- If you are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact information with each other and a ski area employee.
